Annual Meeting Discussion and Neighborhood News

- ***Subdivision Garage Sale*** —The subdivision Garage Sale will be Thursday-Saturday, July 10th to July 12th to coincide with the Milford Village Sidewalk Sales downtown. No need to get a permit, we did that for you!
- ***"Nextdoor" Website and Smartphone App*** — Milford Heights will be starting a new form of communication within the subdivision using a product called Nextdoor. By utilizing the website (nextdoor.com) or Smartphone App, it allows our neighbors to communicate in a safe, private, social network. Users will be able to post messages to our neighbors to inform them of safety concerns or theft, babysitting, garage sales, lost items, etc. Only subdivision residents are allowed access to the site. Look for a "Invite" email from Lydia. Let the communication begin!
- ***MHA Ladies Night Out*** — The first MHA Ladies Night Out is scheduled for June 14th at 7pm at Tavern 131. Hopefully it's warm by then!
- ***RV and Boat Parking*** — Milford Heights bylaws as well as Milford Village ordinance (Section 94-344) prohibits storage of this recreation equipment outdoors at your home. Inside the garage is ok!
- ***Street Parking*** — When parking on the road, please do not block your neighbor's mailbox. Also, note the fire lane. In our neighborhood, the South side of the road is generally the fire lane and should be clear at all times. Please let your guests know.
- ***Pets*** — Please be considerate of your neighbors and remember to pick up your pet waste on neighborhood walks. Also note that dogs must be on a leash at all times when being walked. These are Milford Village Ordinances.
